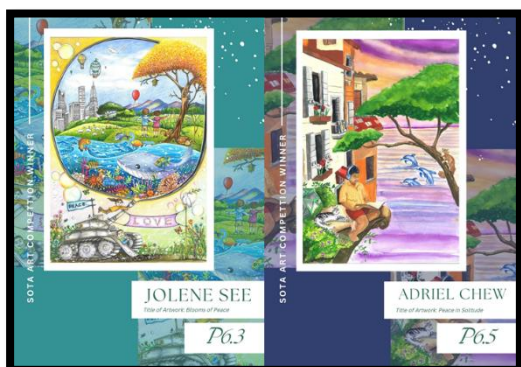
5. *School Attire*

3. Purchase bottled mineral water at the canteen or seek assistance from the General Office if he/she forgets his/her water bottle. Additionally, there are several water coolers conveniently installed within the school compound for student's consumption.

Please note that, except for essential items like spectacles, medication, and house keys, the school will not permit the delivery of items during curriculum time. We appreciate your understanding in allowing your child/ward to learn from his/her oversights as we strive to instill responsibility in our students. We sincerely thank you for your continued collaboration with our school as we work together to nurture resilient and responsible youths. We also appeal to you to respect our staff when they decline requests to pass certain items to your child/ward.
